

IELTS Speaking Parts Two and Three on hospitality

Student A- Examiner

IELTS Speaking Part Two on hospitality

Say "Now I'd like you to give a short presentation. I'd like you to speak for one or two minutes on the topic I will give you. First you have one minute to prepare what you are going to say. You can make notes to help you if you wish. Here is your topic" (*Hand over now*).

After one minute, interrupt the preparation by saying something like "Okay?", "Please start speaking when you're ready" or "Please start your presentation (now)".

If the candidate speaks for less than a minute, gesture that they should continue. If they continue speaking after 2 minutes interrupt them. When they stop or have been stopped, ask a question about what they said.

IELTS Speaking Part Three on hospitality

For four minutes, continue the discussion with more general questions on the topic of 'hospitality', for example:

- "Do people your age usually prefer to have parties at home or go out to a restaurant, bar etc?"
- "In your country, does the person who invites someone out for dinner always pay?"
- "Are there any rules or customs in your country you have to think about when you are invited to someone's house?"
- "Are there any topic you shouldn't talk about in a social occasion?"
- "Do you think people are becoming more relaxed about those kinds of rules?"

After four minutes, finish the test by saying "Thank you. That is the end of the test"

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Student B- Candidate

Talk about a time when you visited someone else's house. You should say:

- When and how you were invited
- How you replied to the invitation
- If you took anything with you
- What you did in that person's house

And say if you prefer socialising in people's homes or in restaurants etc.
